<u>Refugee sponsorship update 6:</u> News about the family we have agreed to sponsor is hard to come by. So far, we are expecting a couple in their late forties, two young men aged 19 and 20 (who will be government-sponsored but are related to our case), a 10-year-old boy, and two girls, 9 and 13. Altogether, 23 privately-sponsored Syrian refugees are being processed for resettlement in the St. Catharines area; we just don't know when they will arrive.

<u>Donation of household goods:</u> please check the sign-up sheets in the mailbox area to see if there are needs unmet. If you have winter clothing to give away, please hang onto it for a while longer. Thank you for all your support!

<u>Turkey Supper tickets are on sale!</u> Two Turkey Suppers are being offered this year: **Fri. Dec. 11**th **& Sat. Dec. 12**th. Tickets are \$15 each and are available in the foyer before and after the service and in the office through the week.
