Our Upcoming Sermon Series...

PASSION – unpacking the heartbeat of Paul's letter to the Colossians

The apostle Paul wrote from a prison cell a celebrative short letter to the emerging church in Colosse. At the heart of his word to these Christians was a passionate appeal for them to live in the reality that God had rescued them from the dominion of darkness and brought them into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom they have redemption, the forgiveness of sins (1:13, 14). The letter to the Colossians is all about being receptive to the work of Christ in securing for us release from the disappointment of morally bankrupt living. The provision of Jesus reaches into the core of our being with the liberating message of deliverance and calls us to follow Him as rescued rescuers. And so, as we journey forward from the Easter event, we embrace the apostle's passionate call to journey with our victorious Lord.

FIRE SYSTEM UPDATE:

Throughout the month of April we had our entire fire safety system inspected. These annual inspections are mandatory and ensure that the fire system, is working properly and that we are complying with the Ontario Fire Regulations.

We will require a new panel to accommodate the automatic doors that we already have installed throughout the church. Due to age, the panel can no longer support all of the existing fire doors with automatic closers, therefore we have had to post the red fire door signs.

There are several doors that routinely required wedges to hold them open for functions. These doors will have a magnetic style holding system installed. By installing these magnets we will no longer require wedges to hold open the kitchen, gym and other doors leading in and out of the sanctuary.

We would like to remind everyone that the current automatic doors have a small black button on the silver arm mechanism found on the top of the door. When the button is pushed, the door will close. Please <u>never pull a door closed</u>, this will bend the arms and is very costly to repair. (see photo)



We thank everyone for your patience as we have the systems inspected and repaired. Once the repairs are completed all doors will be able to be held open on their own, comply with the fire code regulations and be able to close automatically should a fire signal be triggered.
