**Leader 2:** In saying goodbye to Steve, we release him from his responsibilities as Associate Pastor of Niagara United Mennonite Church. Will you join me in this release?

People: With God's help, we release Steve from his responsibilities as our Associate Pastor.

**Steve:** I thank you, the members and friends of Niagara United Mennonite Church, for the love and support you have shown me while I have ministered among you. As I leave, I carry with me all that I have learned here.

People: We also ask God's blessing on your future work in the Kingdom of God and offer our support and encouragement to you as your ministry unfolds in new settings. We pray God's blessings on you and on us as we begin a new relationship with each other, in which you are no longer our pastor.

Most gracious and merciful Father, it was you brought us together and it is you who are separating us. Though we are apart, we are still part of your family and for that we give you thanks. For Steve, grant him your wisdom as he takes on his new role. Bless the Cox family as they start a new home in a new place. For us who remain here, help to sense your new calling upon us. Help us to take up where Steve has left off and to see the new paths you are laying out for us.

Where there is fear and doubt in all of this, fill it with the hope and the joy that comes from knowing that you are the author of all that is good. Bless and help us as we move into your future. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

<u>Associate Pastor: German Worship</u> – The proposal by the German Worship team to hire an Associate Pastor on a 35% part-time basis was approved by the membership at the congregational meeting on May 30. The position has been posted at both the NUMC and MCEC websites for applications to be received by July 15. A search committee, consisting of Hans J. Wiens, Wilhelm (Bill) Harder, Franz Siemens and Udo Woelke, will evaluate applications and invite a chosen applicant to be interviewed and presented to the membership for approval at a special meeting. A starting date of Fall 2017 is anticipated.
