After many years in the role of National Pastor, David Schrader feels called back to pastoral ministry. In early spring, he contacted MCEC to see if there might be ministry opportunities in the Mennonite Church. He learned that our church would have such a position opening up, and felt led to respond to our advertisement for a Leading Pastor.

David says "I came to Christ as a direct result of my grandmother and uncle's influence." He was baptized, and shortly after, received his call to the ministry.

He is originally from the Atlantic Provinces and has served in various ministerial roles from Youth Pastor, Hospital Chaplain, Associate Pastor to Senior Pastor. Currently, he serves as the National Pastor for the Congregational Christian Churches in Canada whose mission statement is "Proclaiming Jesus Christ, Making Disciples, Growing Healthy Churches".

The Search Committee reviewed and discussed David's MCEC documents and Ministerial Leadership Information and met with David and his wife Betty, on November 8th, following up with a formal interview held on November 21st. Several comments from the Search Committee members include "the candidate resonates with passion for the Christian faith"; "both the candidate and his wife have a warm and caring openness to them"; "from our conversations and his previous experiences he has a strong sense of calling to carry out God's work".

David Schrader and his wife Betty live in Brantford. They have four children and five grandchildren.
