The spell-check feature on my Microsoft Word program made an incorrect correction on a Christmas greeting I had written that actually ended up being quite instructive. It changed the title to the familiar Christmas song from 'Away in a Manger' to 'A way in a Manger.' This 'correction' helps us to understand that the real miracle of Christmas is found not only in realizing that Jesus came, but in understanding why He came. Jesus' entrance into human history is a clear declaration that God has initiated *a way* for us to be reconnected to Him in loving relationship. The Bible has this to say about God's plan for Jesus' coming into the world

– This is how God showed his love for us: God sent his only Son into the world so we might live through him. ¹⁰This is the kind of love we are talking about—not that we once upon a time loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to clear away our sins and the damage they've done to our relationship with God. (1 John 4:9-10 The Message)

Through the wonder of God's love as displayed in the manger there is *a way* for you and me to enjoy the fullness of life God has planned. It is by embracing the purpose of Jesus' coming; to understand that the reason He entered a manger was to offer Himself as the One who would make a way to experience the fullness of God's grace and peace.
